9/85 - 6/88 President of Weathers Reports Inc. Small medical software company offering several highly sophisticated psychological testing programs. Independent reviewers repeatedly voted one of these as the best available.

1/91 - Present Private practice limited to the assessment and drug-free treatment of children and adults with ADHD. This includes the development of a patented psychotherapy machine called Computer Aided Emotional Restructuring (CAER) as well as a set of treatment follow-up software packages: WebCAER (an online version of CAER), the Homework Messenger and Goals Program. I have written two well received books on the drug-free treatment of ADHD (ADHD: A Path to Success and ADHD: Drug-free and Doin' Fine)

8/76 – 1/91 Private practice focusing primarily on children and their families.

7/75 - 7/78 Professor, Florida Mental Health Institute, and Director, Research and Evaluation Section. Supervised all aspects of four large innovative Residential and Community Research and Dissemination Projects for Adults and Adolescents including the development of a statewide forensics evaluation and training program. These treatment programs were systematically disseminated state wide as they were developed. Combined, the two projects represented 112 residential beds, more than 100 staff, 7 of which were Ph.D.'s and 2 were M.D.'s.

A major emphasis was on parent training and community interventions. This model was replicated at two more sites.
